

# Beckley Church of England Primary School

## PE and Sports Premium 2018 – 2019



*Total for 2018-2019 academic year **£17,080***

The purpose of this document is to explain how Beckley School intends to spend the PE and Sports Grant for the 2018 – 2019 academic year.

OCC Guidance on how to use the grant:

*The following is included to provide schools with guidance as to how they can use the PE and sport premium  
Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.*

*This means that you should use the premium to:*

- *develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers*
- *make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years*

*For example, you can use your funding to:*

- *hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers*
- *provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively*
- *introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport*
- *support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs*
- *run sport competitions*
- *increase pupils' participation in the School Games*
- *run sports activities with other schools*

*You should not use your funding to:*

- *employ coaches or specialist teachers to cover planning preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements - these should come out of your core staffing budgets*
- *teach the minimum requirements of the national curriculum - including those specified for swimming (or, in the case of academies and free schools, to teach your existing PE curriculum)*

# PE and Sports Premium Report

The funding allocation is £16,000 plus £10 per pupil in Years 1 – 6.

*Note: CPD opportunities have been focussed on the areas that staff feel less confident teaching.*

### Final Summary of Spending

This year's grant has been spent in a variety of ways:

- **Coaching and school clubs.** This has ensured children experience high quality PE lessons. Teachers experience CPD benefit by learning from the coaches. Children who are particularly passionate about a sport get to experience it in an extracurricular club.
- **Active play equipment.** The School Council has played an active part in gathering opinion from the children in their classes and sharing this at Council meetings. Equipment has been evaluated and replenished on a regular basis. This has led to the purchase of a range of active play equipment. Particularly successful have been:
  - Balance boards, developing children's balancing skills.
  - Skipping ropes, helping with balance, coordination and fitness.
  - Balls, keeping children active playing ball games.
- **Inter school sport.** The school has contributed to the local partnership to support inter school competition. Beckley has taken part in a range of competitions including athletics, swimming (which we won!), Toplink Mini-Olympics and Area Sports Athletics. Here, more-able children are given the chance to compete at a higher level.
- **EYFS play area.** After speaking to the school council and EYFS teachers, an evaluation of the outdoor area was undertaken. A need for more fixed equipment to develop children's upper body strength and coordination was identified. The school commissioned Broxap, a company specialising in this type of equipment, to install a 'Zig-Zag Trail' and 'Trapeze Rings' to meet this need. At time of writing, the installation is planned for late July.
